They need to know what is expected of them, the power (s) they will have, and everything else you think is important for them to know. Another thing to consider is where your agent lives. If they are in another city or state, they should not be selected as your agent, as they would have to travel every time you need something handled. Thus, the ideal agent is someone who lives nearby, can accomplish everything they are asked of, and whom you can trust without a doubt. Documents may have strong powers that will allow the Agent full authority over their property and any financial accounts or limited, which will grant authority to the Agent in a limited capacity or will only act until the law is completed. With most documents of authority, the Director can customize his document to know exactly his wishes, so that the agent understands in writing exactly what is expected. Missouri's sturdy financial form of attorney is a document that is terminated by the director with the aim of granting all the financial authority of a trusted agent so that they can be monitored properly in the absence or illness of the director.
